Welcome once again to the start of a new gardening year and the spring edition of our Newsletter, together with our Programme of Events for 2019.

GARDEN STORE NEWS

RECYCLING OF PLASTIC GARDENING PRODUCTS

As you are no doubt aware St Albans District Council do not recycle black/brown plastic garden products, such as pots and trays.

We are pleased to announce that we have come to an arrangement with a local Garden Centre for the recycling of black/brown plastic gardening products (plant pots, seed trays, pot trays). With immediate effect we will accept these at the hut. In the first instance they will be made available to members free of charge before going for recycling.

Could I please request that items brought for recycling are reasonably clean.

PLEASE DO NOT BRING US ANY HOUSEHOLD BLACK PLASTIC (FOOD TRAYS ETC). - Failure to comply with this request will result in the scheme being withdrawn.

Don't forget that when buying fertilisers etc at the hut it would be great if you could bring your own container. This will help us reduce our use of plastic bags. As you know - every little helps.

SEED POTATOES

Seed potatoes will be available as from 2nd February. **All are certified, high quality, Scottish seed potatoes, free from blackleg, blight and virus diseases.** This year we are offering the following varieties:-

RED DUKE OF YORK - **First early.** Wonderful strong flavour, general purpose but best fried, roasted or mashed. Resistant to scab. Plant late March, harvest end of June.

SWIFT - **First early.** Very early. Good in pots, short stems. Good disease resistance, Plant late March, harvest June.

NADINE - **Second early.** High disease resistance. Looks good on the exhibition bench. Very high yields. Plant early April, harvest July/Aug.

KING EDWARD- **Maincrop.** Excellent flavour suitable for wide range of uses, especially roasting. Resistant to scab. Sow early April, harvest July/August.

CHARLOTTE - Salad/Second early. This French bred, highly popular potato is the salad variety of choice. The smooth skinned tubers have a light yellow flesh which has wonderful flavour and delightful waxy texture. Sow late March, harvest June - Sept.

PRICE - All varieties - £1 per Kg.

Once again we have maintained our low prices for high quality seed potatoes. These prices represent outstanding value at an unbeatable price.

We do not supply quantities of less than 1kg but in response to members requests we are happy to provide a 1kg mixed bag (£1.20) to customer requirements.

Each Kg will contain approx 12 - 16 tubers (depending on variety).

Plant 10cms/4ins deep; 30cms/12ins to 38cms/15ins apart; 50cms/18ins between rows except for King Edward, 68cms/27ins between rows.

Onion sets and shallots are also in stock.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The meeting was preceded by an enjoyable and colourful talk on Five English Gardens by Amanda Shipman.

The AGM was attended by 45 members.

The Chairman welcomed all members present and told the meeting on the whole it had been a successful year with membership remaining roughly unchanged, gaining some new members while losing a few old members. Hut sales were not brilliant, sales of general fertilisers and seed potatoes were poor while composts (which we don't make a profit on) and bird seed were good. The trend of declining hut sales needs to be addressed - use it or lose it springs to mind.

The Annual Show was, once again, a success with excellent entries even following on the very hot, dry summer. A very big thank you to Ginder & sons for their continued sponsorship of the show. The chairman continues to represent the Club on the Parish in Bloom initiatives and we once again sponsored the Inter Schools Competition, which was won by Park Street school. It was disappointing that some schools chose not to participate.

There were three, well attended, excellent talks during the year and three very successful outings. In June our "Gardens of Norfolk" 5 day tour was thoroughly enjoyable and this year we will be going to South Wales.

Help is always needed at the hut and we will also need helpers on our stall at the Parish Fete on Sunday 20 May.

REMEMBER - MORE HANDS MAKE LIGHT WORK.

Thanks to the committee for their hard work and support, volunteers on the rota and other helpers during the year plus thanks to the Parish Council for their help and support. Graham thanked all our members for giving their support in various ways.

Martyn Dadswell, our Treasurer for the last 10 years has decided to step down from the position due to health problems. Graham proposed a vote of thanks for all his hard work over many years. Graham presented the financial report and the audited accounts were unanimously approved by a show of hands.

Andrew Keates was elected as the new Treasurer and existing committee members were re-elected (see end of Newsletter for details). In addition Suzanna Featherstone was elected onto the committee. The chairman also thanked our auditor, Mrs Johnson, who is also standing down after many years.

A committee proposal to move the financial year end from 30 September to 31 December was approved unanimously. Next years AGM will be held in early 2020, date yet to be set.
